When I think of her, I think of when I got my first job on island; I was distraught and anxious when sent home for a uniform violation, as I didn't own the article of clothing they wanted me to wear. I also vividly remember my first week when every single day she would tell me to make a piece of art: "Come on! What'd you make today? Let me see. What will you create next?" She would not just compliment my work, but always encourage me to do better.
